Waste Product	Disposal Procedure
Used Motor Oil	Recycle with Thermofluids 800-350-7565
Cardboard Boxes	Recycle with Central Wash. Recycling when practical
Rinstate Water	Apply Via Weed Sprayer to Fallow Land
Paper and Paper Products	Recycle with Central Wash. Recycling when practical
Tree Prunings	Chip into Mulch Redistribute on Site
Large Prunings	Prunings too large for chipping will be sold as fire wood.
Scrap Metal Used/Scrap	Recycle with Central Wash. Recycling
Tires	Recycle with Nearest Tire Distributer
Used Batteries	Recycle with Nearest Distributer (NAPA, Allied)
Pesticide Containers	Recycle with Wilbur Ellis or NW Ag Plastics Recycle during County Clean up in Spring and Fall
Obsolete Pesticide	
Portable Toilet Waste	Send to plant for processing
Glass Containers/ Other Glass	Recycle with Central Wash. Recycling as Allowed
Plastic Containers	Recycle with Central Wash. Recycling as Allowed

Sources of Pollution	Process for Reducing Pollution
Vehicles, Tractors and Equipment	Keep equipment well maintained, research alt. fuels
Application of Pesticide	Apply only as required. Research alt. options
